 10. Cure Finders: Cystic Fibrosis representative and Debbie (a mother of a cystic fibrosis patient) spoke about the cystic fibrosis foundation. Debbie spoke to BCASC about her son and his disability. Cystic Fibrosis is a disease where you cannot digest food the right way. Cure Finders is all around the country. It is a fundraiser that works with the school system to raise money to find a cure. Debbie tells BCASC that any money donated to the foundation can go a long way. It is also mentioned that a well-known fundraiser that is used to raise money at schools is called "sixty-five roses" which has a story behind it of a young boy who had this disease but could not say it. In the past schools have used "sixty-five roses" as the name of their fundraiser and sold roses and the money raised would go to the foundation. As an incentive to the schools, the Cystic Fibrosis foundation will throw a pep-rally for the school that raises the most money. Forms will be passed out after the meeting with contact information on the back.
