

SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMPS

1. WHAT ARE SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMPS?

Summer leadership camps are usually three, four and five-day retreats at which students are taught the basic leadership skills that they will need to function as officers. The camps are co-educational and the registration fees include room and board but not, usually, transportation.

2. WHO SPONSORS THE MAJOR SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMPS?

In the state, Florida Rotary Clubs sponsor two camps called the Seminar for Tomorrow's Leaders (S4TL), the School Board of Broward County, Florida sponsors the South Florida Leadership Training Camp (SFLTC) and Camp Eagle-Advanced Leadership Training and Broyhill Industries sponsors a camp.

3. WHERE AND WHEN ARE THESE CAMPS HELD?

There is an S4TL camp held in Miami and another in Lakeland. The South Florida Leadership Training Camp and Camp Eagle-Advanced Leadership Training are held on the campus of Nova-Southeastern University in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida.

4. WHAT DOES IT COST TO ATTEND THE SUMMER LEADERSHIP CAMPS?

The national camps cost approximately \$450.00. The 2012 registration fees for both SFLTC and Camp Eagle-Advanced Leadership Training Camp is \$350.00 per delegate.

5. WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN SFLTC AND CAMP EAGLE?

SFLTC is the camp first time attending delegates should attend. This camp covers basic leadership in terms of ideas, situations, decorum, etc. Camp Eagle is an advanced training program for the leaders of tomorrow. Delegates planning to attend Camp Eagle must have attended SFLTC or another development leadership camp prior to registering for Camp Eagle.
